#### Whole School Camp - Totara Springs, Matamata

It is great to see that nearly all students are coming to camp in Week 4. Not long to go now! This is excellent! The students will have so much fun!



A reminder that the **students who are not going to camp are still required to attend school each day as normal** - staying home because they are not going to camp is not a justified reason for absence and they will be marked as truant if they do. **The school has employed a relieving teacher (Jessica Hall) to teach all non-campers together for the week**; she will deliver the learning programme planned by their classroom teacher.

We ask parents to contribute \$100.00 to the cost of camp (total cost \$280 per child). Parents can continue to make payments via <u>Kindo</u> or at the school office. **Due date for payments is Wednesday 10 May.** Please don't hesitate to contact us if you are not able to meet this deadline - we don't want this to be a barrier to students attending camp - we can always find a way to help!

### **Homework - Mathletics**

The school pays for every student to have their own Mathletics subscription (\$21.83 per student) with the expectation that they work on their Mathletics at least three times a week for half an hour as their homework. We had a number of parents saying last night "why doesn't our child have homework?". **They do - it is their Mathletics!!** 

Teachers assign activities on Mathletics that align with the Maths that students are doing in class. They also assign activities that will help your child "fill in some gaps" that the teacher currently notices with their Maths knowledge. We purchase the Year 7 to Year 13 programme subscription, so the Mathletics has a different "feel" to what they may have experienced if they had Mathletics at primary school.

We are finding a lot of our students are lagging behind in their Maths knowledge - the Board pays for this subscription to help them catch up as much as possible so they are well prepared for high school. We would appreciate parent support in making sure students do their Maths homework regularly!
