Manu Tioriori Festival

The choir has been rehearsing very hard learning the songs for the Manu Tioriori Festival which is taking place up at the Due Drop Centre next term on Wednesday 1 November. The Pasifika Group, Kapa Haka and Chinese Fan Dance will also be performing.

Tickets are now on sale at the start of Term 4 and they are very limited as the BNZ Theatre only seats 650 in the audience; our school is only allocated 100 tickets. To enable as many of our students

performing to get tickets for their family, we have restricted ticket sales to two adult and two child tickets per family. (and you can't swap them out)

- \$15 for an adult ticket
- \$10.00 for a childs ticket
- \$40.00 for two adults, two children. Additional children \$10.00 each.

Tickets will be able to be purchased from Whaea Mel in the Resource Room. Once we run out, we will start a waiting list for tickets as we are hopeful other schools will have some to spare that we can get the week before the festival.



NO SCHOOL FOR STUDENTS

Teacher Only Day - Monday 20 November

The Ministry of Education has allocated a teacher-only day in Term 4 to enable schools to spend time understanding, preparing and engaging with changes being made to *The New Zealand Curriculum*. These days have to be taken between the 13th - 24th November. **A reminder that the school board has decided on Monday 20 November.** Students will not be at school on this day.

High School Enrolments

A reminder that all Year 8 students should have their enrolments sorted for high school as soon as possible. To date we only have 28% of our Year 8 students enrolled.

If your child has been accepted for an Out of Zone enrolment for high school, it is important that parents let us know and send us a copy of the acceptance letter. Manurewa High, Alfriston College and James Cook High regularly send us updated enrolments lists so it is not necessary if your child is going to one of those schools.

At the end of the year, when your child is withdrawn, the Ministry of Education expects us to enter into their record the name of the high school they will be attending - this is why we need to know as well.

The local high schools have just this week informed us of their transition days **for students who have completed the enrolment process:** They are as follows:

- Manurewa High School 27 November
- James Cook High School 28 November
- Alfriston College 29 November

New Navigators Programme - for Year 7 students

Our Year 7 students all have the opportunity this term to take part in the New Navigators programme which introduces them to marine sports while at the same time teaching them about water safety and

the marine environment. Keep an eye out for the notice with all the information including the permission slips which classroom teachers will be sending home soon.

Some of our students are very fortunate to have the opportunity to take part in The Brave Project. 'The Brave Project', founded by AJ Hackett, aims to develop resilience in students. So, after completing a unit looking at what causes fear, the physical effects, and strategies in overcoming fear, a group of our students have the opportunity to put their learning into practise by completing a Bungy jump off the Auckland Harbour Bridge next Tuesday 17 October. School Uniform for Term 4

Please make sure your child is wearing the correct uniform for Term 4; in particular **students are NOT to wear long pants during Term 4** - this is the winter uniform only! We find students get far too hot (and smelly!) in Term 4 and it affects their ability to focus on their learning. We also do not want to see students wearing hoodies etc at school either. This is a deliberate choice on their part and it is becoming particularly prevalent, particularly with some Year 8's.

We would appreciate parents reinforcing this with their child. We are working very hard to get all our students to develop good work habits before they transition to high school. Trust us - there are very few high schools who accept students wearing non uniform clothes to school!
