
Principal's message

David Hill. This experience allowed students to gain insights into the authors' journeys and draw inspiration from their life stories and works. The festival, held at the Aotea Center, provided a unique platform for our students to deepen their love for Reading and Writing. Our students demonstrated great enthusiasm and engagement throughout the event, making the most of this invaluable learning opportunity. As an added bonus, our school has been given \$1000 in tokens which can be used to order books for our students who attended the trip, our library, as well as students who do not have access to any joyful literature in their homes.

Maths Parent Evening

On Wednesday, 22nd May, the GIS Maths Waka Pod is hosting a "Parent Partnership Night", from 6:30pm - 7:30pm. The aim of this night is to promote maths-at-home with whānau. The Maths Waka Pod will be covering such aspects as: Life Skill Maths (time, bus timetables, measuring), Financial Literacy, Maths Board Games, and Mathletics. If you would like to know how to support your child with their math then this is the workshop for you. Come along and support your child.

This term, the students at Greenmeadows Intermediate School have been engaged in their classroom inquiries. Each class has visited Brylee Park Reserve in Conifer Grove. Here, our students have explored the local mangrove ecosystems. These field trips were facilitated by our classroom teachers with the support of Vivek Gopal (Learning Support Coordinator). During these sessions, our students were able to think and act like scientists. This involved using microscopes, collecting samples, sketching, and recording their observations. Ultimately, this experience provided our students with some insight into topics such as the impacts of dredging on land as well as biodiversity and the overall health of mangrove ecosystems. Our students are motivated and on track to complete this unit of inquiry successfully.
