I hope everyone has a lovely break. We look forward to seeing all students back at school on Monday 14 October at 9.00a.m.

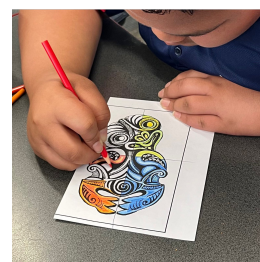

Our Attendance Statistics are looking pretty good!

With the winter cold and flu bugs rampant, there has been a lot of sickness in Term 3 for both students and staff. Despite this up until the end of last week, we still had 64.5% of students attending school more than 90% of the time. This is outstanding and a big improvement from Term 2 when we had 57% of students attending school regularly. Attendance is slightly better in Year 7 than in Year 8. For comparison, in Term 1 this year, 53% of students in South Auckland attended school regularly.

I just thought it important to share our great attendance data - particularly at a time when there is a lot in the media about how shocking NZ's attendance statistics are. Our school target is to have 65% of students attending school regularly - if we keep going like this, we will reach this target by the end of year - how cool would that be!
